# **Better Practice Awards 2018**

Emma Dennis represented Yackandandah Health at the Australian Aged Care Quality Agency 2018 Better Practice Awards in Sydney on Thursday 23<sup>rd</sup> August. Yackandandah Health was awarded a Better Practice Commendation Award in recognition of our work towards creating an intergenerational model of care. "The Better Practice Commendation Awards represent exemplars of good practice. These awards retain a clear focus on quality and safety for consumers and are central to the Quality Agency's role in promoting consumer focused, high quality aged care and services throughout Australia. Nominations come from a range of service types, locations and sizes, covering the breadth and diversity of providers in Australia."

Yack Health was the only aged care provider in the region to receive an award. CEO Annette Nuck said the committee of Management wanted to offer an environment where the elders living in residential aged care were genuinely part of the community and the broader community was actively involved with the organisation. Earlier this year, a group of parents came to talk to us about our model of care and how childcare could fit with our vision of intergenerational care. We were excited as having childcare was a wonderful opportunity. With an amazing group of parents, we have been working toward creating a model for childcare that meets the needs and hopes of the Yackandandah community.

The Childcare Centre will be located in the front part of the old hospital, facing Isaacs Avenue. This will be a temporary home until we have the resources to create a purpose-built centre. We envisage a childcare centre that will be a happy and fun place where children's imaginations can soar.

We are extremely grateful for the 'Growing Wise' parent group, led by Jane Shepherd, who are working in the background to achieve the goal of opening the centre before the end of the year. Annette and the Growing Wise group are currently working through the registration process and plans for building renovations. Fundraising will be a key activity in coming months.

"A childcare centre on our site is one of the key elements in the intergenerational model we are developing. Parents are among those we wanted to attract to our services and given they are raising our town's future residents, it's a perfect opportunity." Ms. Nuck said.

Jackie French AM is an Australian author, historian, ecologist, 2014-2015 Australian Children Laureate and 2015 Senior Australian of the Year.

Jackie's books have sold millions of copies and won over 60 awards in Australia and internationally. Jackie is also a patron of literacy programs across Australia. Jackie writes for adults and young adults on history, and her award-winning historical fiction and wrote one famous picture book about a wombat "Diary of a Wombat".

Jackie is a passionate advocate of help for children with learning difficulties as well as the conservation of wildlife and our planet.

For nearly 40 years she has studied the species in the bush where she lives, with publications ranging from scientific articles on wombat ecology or endangered species to her ground-breaking books on theories and practices for pest and weed ecology and more popular books on subjects like backyard self-sufficiency. Jackie and her husband Bryan live in the Araluen valley, a deep valley on the edge of the Deua wilderness area. Most of their property is now a Conservation Refuge for the many rare and endangered species of the area. They live in a homemade stone house, with a waterwheel Bryan made as well as solar panels to power their house, with an experimental orchard of over 800 fruit trees and more than 272 kinds of fruit that show how farming can coexist with wildlife. Jackie writes columns for the Canberra Times, Australian Women's Weekly, Earth garden Magazine, Australian Wellbeing and Gardening Australia. Her garden rambles over about 4 hectares, and there is never a time when there aren't basketsful of many kinds of fruit to pick. We are so excited to have Jackie join us for the weekend. She shares much of what Yackandandah stands for. We hope you can join us and meet this wonderful lady.
