Men's Choir

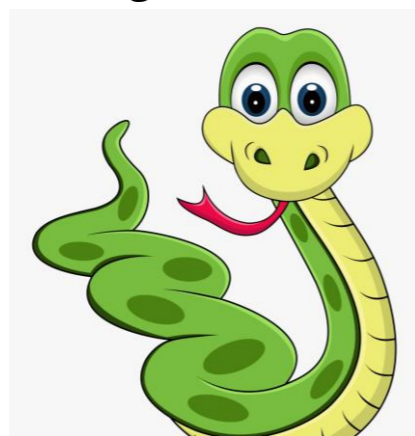
