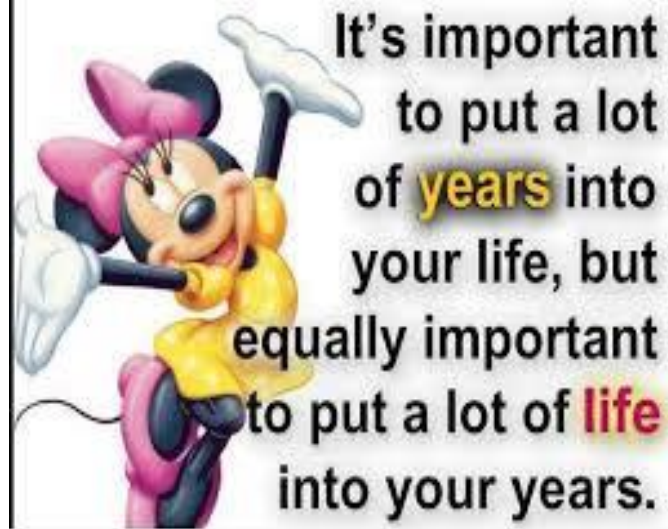
## JOKE OF THE WEEK
