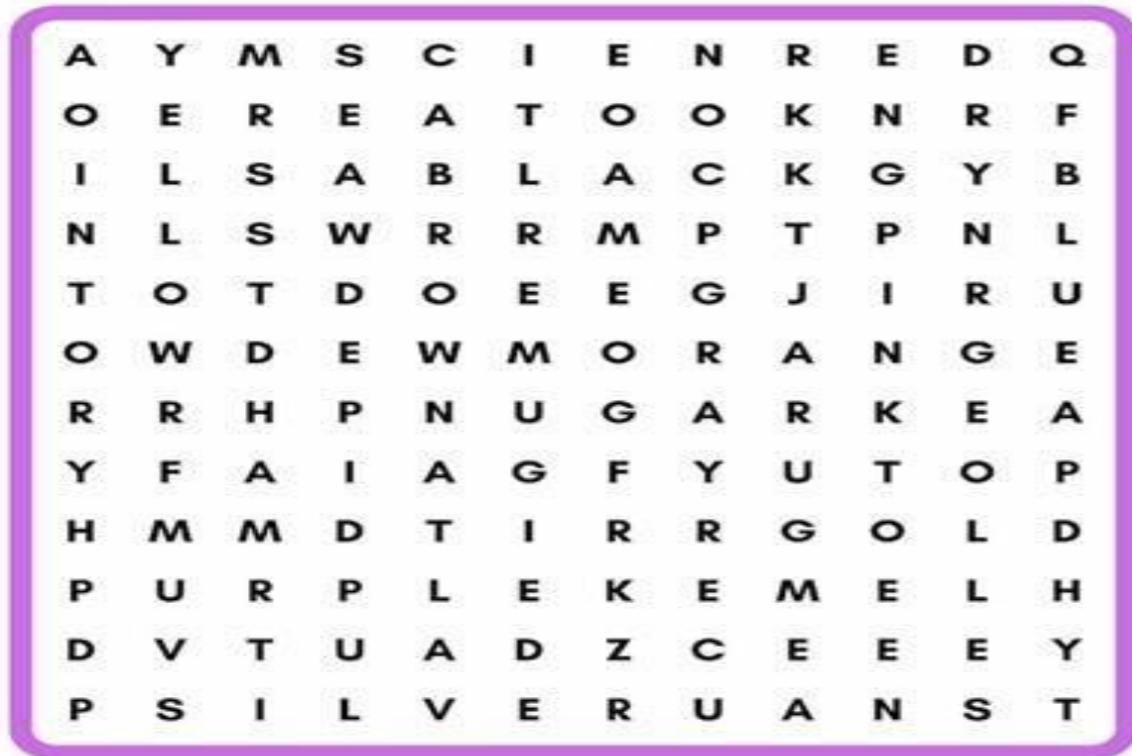

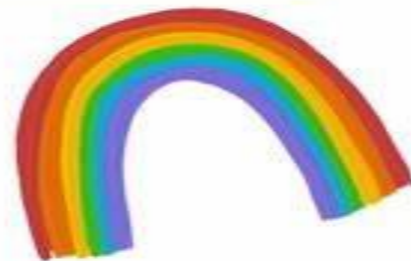


Colors Word Search
